### **GRANDFAMILIES, KINSHIP CARE**

Ranking Member Tim Scott (R-S.C.), along with Chairman Bob Casey (D-Pa.), held a hearing titled "Strengthening Support for Grandfamilies during the COVID-19 Pandemic and Beyond." During the hearing, Sens. Scott and Casey, along with Senators Todd Young (R-Ind.) and Mark Kelly (D-Ariz.), unveiled their new legislation, the <u>Informing Grandfamilies Act</u>, to help support grandparents raising children. The bill would require states to communicate directly with grandparents who apply for assistance through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program and provide information about additional support.

## BIPARTISAN LETTER TO MAKE VA WEBSITES MORE ACCESSIBLE

U.S. Senate Aging Committee Ranking Member Tim Scott (R-S.C.) and Chairman Bob Casey (D-Pa.) led a bipartisan, bicameral group of committee leaders in sending a letter to U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Secretary Denis McDonough, urging the agency to improve VA website accessibility for disabled individuals, many of whom are seniors.

# ENSURING SENIORS' ACCESS TO QUALITY CARE ACT

Ranking Member Tim Scott (R-S.C.) and Senator Mark R. Warner (D-Va.) re-introduced the <u>Ensuring Seniors' Access to Quality Care Act</u>, which would bolster the nursing home workforce by allowing more facilities to train Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) and enabling facilities to access a comprehensive background check database when hiring employees. Sens. Scott and Warner first introduced this legislation in 2019.

Specifically, the legislation would allow a senior living facility to reinstate its CNA training program if:

- The facility has corrected the deficiency;
- The deficiency did not result in an immediate risk to patient safety and is not the result of patient harm resulting from abuse or neglect; and
- The facility has not received a repeat deficiency related to direct patient harm in the preceding two year period.
