Advancing Equity

The Better Care Better Jobs Act would support a core tenet of President Biden's agenda: to advance equity for all, including people of color and others who have been historically underserved, marginalized and adversely affected by persistent poverty and inequality. Here's how:

The Better Care Better Jobs Act would create over 500,000 new home care jobs and raise wages for workers—before the pandemic, the median wage for these workers was just \$12 per hour.¹





People of color make up the vast majority of the home care workforce:

- 63% of the 2.4 million home care workers are people of color²
- 27% are Black or African American³
- 24% are Hispanic or Latino⁴
- 9% are Asian or Pacific Islander⁵
- 2% are Other Ethnic/Racial Groups⁶



Only one quarter of home care workers employed by an agency have employer-sponsored health care coverage. The Better Care Better Jobs Act will ensure employers have more resources to provide more robust benefits to workers.



One in six home care workers live in poverty and 53% receive some public assistance.⁸ The Better Care Better Jobs Act would reduce reliance on these programs.



Among home care workers, median annual earnings for women are less than \$19,400, compared to \$22,100 for men.⁹ The Better Care Better Jobs Act would raise wages for workers.



The number of older adults is expected to increase from 54.1 million in 2019 to 94.7 million by 2060. The continued growth of the aging population makes it even more critical to invest in the workforce that provides these services.
